from Me; Our Love is Here to Stay; Maria and the Ascot chorus from My Fair Lady – all classics in their way.

Some of the less shy participants (or should I say those with guts) gave us solo renditions of some of the songs mentioned above. Daniel helped them through it, giving tips on presentation (so very important) and voice.

As someone who has attended Daniel's Musical Theatre Workshops and today continues to take voice lessons under his guidance,I can see how he manages through his professionalism and vast experience in this field to make a silk purse out a (kosher) sow's ear.

This workshop was a new idea and in a way an experiment. However, I certainly think it would be worthwhile if EADI considers putting this on the annual calendar as an extra addition to the Acting Workshops.
